Main questions

Are you a fundraiser completing this request on behalf of a group?

Are you a fundholder for this request?

Unregistered / informal group you are applying on behalf of?

What do you want funding for?

Committee you are applying to

Provide the name, phone number and email address of someone from your group we can contact to discuss your request.

Does this request involve capital item purchases such as land, buildings, renovations, machinery, vehicles, furniture or items of office equipment and with a unit cost of \$1000 or more?

What are the outcomes your mahi (activities / project) is aiming to achieve?

Prompt: What do you hope to achieve with this grant? What change or difference are you trying to make?

Example: We will deliver youth driver training programmes. This programme will give youth a qualification, ensures safety and wellbeing of our community and removes barriers to youth participating in training, volunteering or work opportunities.

Recommended length: One or two paragraphs.

Who will benefit the most from your mahi?

Prompt: Name the specific groups or populations your activities or project are designed for. If applicable, name any specific hapū or iwi which will benefit.

Example: Our event is open to all ages and abilities. However, we specifically designed the event for our local rural community.

Recommended length: One or two sentences.

How are community, hapū or iwi involved in your project?

Prompt: What engagement, collaboration or consultation has there been with the wider community? What ongoing involvement will there be?

Example: We held a community meeting where representatives from local schools including youth leaders, community groups, sports club, council and police discussed unsocial behaviour happening in our community. The group identified more youth focused activities where youth are engaged in meaningful activities in the community was needed. The group will meet monthly to monitor the programme to ensure it is meeting the needs of our youth. We will adapt the programme based on the feedback we receive from participants.

Recommended length: One or two paragraphs.

Which ethnic group or community will benefit most from your activities or project?

Where will your activities or project provide the most benefit?

How many years are you requesting funding for? Amount

Is the request for: operating costs, project costs or operating and project costs

Missing question: budget provided is for the year ending?
